RE: NOTICE OF SUSPENSION OF REGISTRAR'S ABILITY TO CREATE NEW REGISTERED NAMES OR INITIATE INBOUND TRANSFERS OF REGISTERED NAMES

Dear Vincent Hamm,

This notice is sent to Aim High!, Inc. ("Aim High") further to its Registrar Accreditation Agreement ("RAA") with the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers ("ICANN") dated 30 September 2014 ("RAA").

Pursuant to Section 5.5.3 of the RAA, ICANN has found that Aim High knowingly employs an officer that is judged by a court of competent jurisdiction to have committed fraud or breach of fiduciary duty and such officer has not been terminated within thirty (30) days of Aim High's knowledge of the foregoing.

Based on the prior collaboration of Aim High, ICANN elects to suspend, rather than terminate, Aim High. Aim High's ability to create new Registered Names or initiate inbound transfers of Registered Names is suspended for 90 days pursuant to Section 5.7 of the RAA.

The suspension is effective 23 January 2017 at 00:00 UTC and will conclude on 23 April 2017 at 00:00 UTC, or longer if Aim High has not demonstrated compliance on or before 31 March 2017.

Consistent with Section 5.7 of the RAA, during the suspension period, Aim High must not:

- 1. Create new Registered Names for any generic top-level domain ("gTLD"); or
- 2. Initiate or accept inbound transfers of Registered Names for any gTLD.

To demonstrate compliance, Aim High must timely cure all breaches identified in this notice of suspension by taking the following actions:

- 1. Provide ICANN with corrective and preventative action(s), including implementation date(s) and evidence thereof, to ensure that Aim High will cure the existing noncompliance, and remain in compliance, with Section 5.5.3 of the RAA;
- 2. Provide ICANN with an updated and completed Registrar Information Specification (RIS) form, including the required supporting documentation and the location of any applicable information required to be published on Aim High's website, as required by Section 3.17 of the RAA;
- 3. Deposit gTLD registration data on a weekly basis to an approved escrow agent and ensure that the deposits meet the required specifications;
- 4. Display domain name data in the specified response format, as required by Section 1.4 of the Whois Specification;
- 5. Clearly display a link to renewal fees, post-expiration renewal fees (if different) and redemption/restore fees on Aim High's website and provide a link to the renewal fees, post-expiration renewal fees (if different) and redemption/restore fees in Aim High's registration agreement;
- 6. Publish an email address to receive abuse reports on the home page of Aim High's website;
- 7. Publish a description of Aim High's procedures for the receipt, handling and tracking of abuse reports on Aim High's website; and
- 8. Display the ICANN logo on Aim High's website in accordance with the Logo License Specification of the RAA by removing all reference to parties that are not ICANN-accredited registrars from websites where the logo appears, or remove the ICANN logo from Aim High's website(s).



Failure to demonstrate compliance by 31 March 2017 may result in RAA termination and an extension to Aim High's suspension pending final termination.

Notice on Aim High's Website(s)

During the suspension period, Aim High must prominently display the following on its website on all pages where Registrar Services, as defined by the RAA, are offered:

No new gTLD registrations or inbound transfers will be accepted from 23 January 2017 through 23 April 2017

This notice must also include a link to the notice of suspension from ICANN.

Please be advised that Aim High may be subject to escalated compliance action (including RAA termination) if ICANN receives additional information, either through complaints or its own monitoring, demonstrating that Aim High continues to violate the RAA or Consensus Policies, after the suspension period ends.
